Ukrainian Heritage Festival Saturday, June 30th & Sunday, July 1st

On June 30th and July 1st Tremont will be host to the first of what is projected to be an annual event, the Cleveland Ukrainian Heritage Festival: (<https://cleukrainianheritagefest.weebly.com/about.html>) Our neighborhood is renowned for its diversity, rich immigrant history and ethnic heritage, which includes Ukrainians who first came to Cleveland for jobs during the 19th Century Industrial Revolution and settled what was then known as the "South Side."

The Heritage Festival is envisioned as a way for the broader community to learn more about Cleveland's more than-century-old Ukrainian community which has been replenished by new immigrants nearly every generation since the 1880s and sustained by those whose ancestors came here generations ago. The Festival is sponsored by two local non-profit organizations—the Ukrainian Museum-Archives (UMA) and the Cleveland Maidan Association. The UMA is well-known and well-established in Tremont, serving the community on the north side of Lincoln Park since 1952. The Cleveland Maidan Association was organized in 2014 to provide aid to those who were wounded or to families of those who were killed during the Euromaidan Revolution of Dignity in Kyiv and in the Russian-led conflict in the East which followed.

The Festival will take place on the grounds of the Ukrainian Museum-Archives. Starting Saturday June 30th at noon and continuing into the evening and then again at noon on Sunday, July 30th,

the Festival will feature exhibits, authentic Ukrainian cuisine, all day entertainment from local and visiting performers, a beer garden featuring Ukrainian and domestic beers on tap and lots of fun. Proceeds from the festival will be dedicated to support the missions of the respective organizations.

In addition to its charitable goal, the Cleveland Ukrainian Heritage Festival will be a part of the first city-wide, week-long celebration of Cleveland's place in history featuring Canalway Partners, Downtown Cleveland Alliance, League Park, Western Reserve Historical Society and many others: (<http://canalwaypartners.com/events/clevelandhistorydays/>)

Organizers of Cleveland History Days also see this as becoming an annual event, drawing attention to the organizations and personalities which built Cleveland, made it one of America's premier cities and are now re-energizing our community.

Both organizations operate in a historic neighborhood minutes outside of Cleveland and Ms. Riker recently secured a small business loan which allowed her to purchase the building in which her business operates.

"Being able to provide a safe place for dogs to play while employing a diverse group of people who share a passion for dogs make the challenges all worth it. Being in a room full of dogs socializing together combined with having a great team working alongside of me allows the need to fulfill my desires to give back to society by taking in homeless dogs and finding them a new and better life."

Inaugural Cleveland History Days Features Tremont

Mark the days – June 22 – July 1. It's 10 days with more than 30 ways to celebrate Cleveland's History. This new program offers a combination plate of possibilities to explore and experience our history. It begins on Friday, June 22nd with a Grand Opening along the Cuyahoga River at Hart Crane Park and includes the 2nd annual Share the River Ramble (5 pm) – a walk/run along new and future paths and trails within the Flats.

It ends on the weekend of June 30/ July 1 with a new festival: Ukrainian Heritage Festival to be held at the grounds of Ukrainian Museum from 12 noon – 11 pm. A Closing Ceremony will take place at 1 PM on Sunday, July 1 at the Lincoln Park Gazebo. Afterwards, (1:30 pm) a new Take a Hike program based on Tremont's story of immigration is introduced; and a special complimentary tour for cyclists (Take a Bike) will be led by Ohio City Bike Coop.

Cleveland History Days builds upon the success of Take a Hike which enters its 10 year anniversary; it has drawn more than 32,000 visitors through its current 5 programs. This package adds 3 new tours: University Circle, Public Square and Tremont. It includes an Author's Night at the Music Box with three distinguished writers: John Grabowski, Laura DeMarco and Alan Dutka. The Historic Downtown Luncheon Forum (June 27) features Ed McMahon – former President of Scenic America who will speak on the topic – Authenticity and Place-The New Formula for Community Revitalization. From Larry Doby at League Park to a discounted admission to our own Cleveland History Center, spend a week with us – you won't regret it!

School Board to Revisit Building Plan

Acting on an independent watchdog's recommendation, the Cleveland Board of Education will consider revising its master plan for building and renovating schools. It has been four years since the plan was last amended and six years since the District began assembling the data used to modify the document. The Bond Accountability Commission, which was created for the specific purpose of monitoring the ongoing modernization program, has called for an "extensive re-examination" of the plan based on current neighborhood population and enrollment patterns, changes in academic programming and rising construction costs. More recently, the state drastically limited reimbursement for Cleveland's school construction program. The policy changes could force the District to absorb millions of dollars in additional expenses. Before considering revisions, the District will seek direction from the public. Community meetings will begin June 5. The meeting schedule and other information can be found at clevelandmetroschools.org/buildingplan. "We support the commission's recommendation," District CEO Eric Gordon said. "It's logical to re-evaluate the plan under current conditions, and keeping with past practice, we want to ask for guidance from our families and other stakeholders."

The District has built and substantially renovated more than 40 buildings since the program began in 2002. Work is well under way on seven PreK-8 buildings, and construction of two high schools is set to begin soon. In 2014, voters overwhelmingly approved a \$200 million bond issue to help fund the remainder of the program. Plans, based on community input, called for building 20 to 22 schools and remodeling 20 to 23 schools.

The state contributes slightly more than \$2 for every \$1 in local funds spent for construction and substantial renovation. But in an abrupt break from 16 years of practice in Cleveland, the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission has decided to virtually eliminate allowances made for the regional market's higher building costs. The OFCC now wants to hold all districts in the state -- urban, suburban or rural -- to a maximum contribution of \$255 per square foot. The last time the OFCC spent \$255 per square foot for construction in Cleveland was in 2008. The commission is currently paying about \$285 a square foot. Chief Operating Officer Patrick Zohn said that under the change, CMSD would have to pay an extra \$20 million for the eight schools to be built in the next segment of the program. He stated that there were additional variances needed when compared to other projects that have been presented due to the fact that the existing parcel has yet to be split into two parcels. The variances went up for a vote as one motion and were approved. The project will next be taken to the Tremont West economic development committee and ultimately the board of zoning appeals. The Duck Island Greens Space (DIGS) committee reported on the Litterbugz event, where Willey Hill was worked on and some good progress was made along with the W17th area with a mulch delivery (thanks to Chris Blue). The next DIGS committee meeting will happen on May 10th in Abbey Park – and DIGS will partner with the RiverSweep clean-up in Duck Island. Candidates for the TWDC Board of Directors introduced themselves and talked about why they're running for the Board. No additional information has been provided by Michael Symon Restaurants at the time of the meeting. Several candidates running for Tremont West Board of Directors were present and addressed the block club, requesting member support at the upcoming election at the May 17th Annual Membership Dinner and Meeting. Lt. Michael Betley and Sgt. Tim Maffo-Judd of the Second District Cleveland Police provided a safety update, including arrests associated with recent aggravated robberies in the area. They reminded members to take safety precautions, including leaving on outdoor lights and walking in groups. Block club members who have personal security cameras were encouraged to register these cameras through the Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's office, either online or via paper form, in order to allow for information to be used for investigative purposes. The South of Jefferson block club meeting was held on Tuesday, May 8th at the Roosevelt Post 58. Cleveland Police Sgt. Tim Maffo-Judd was our first guest and expressed to the SOJ members that his primary responsibility is to handle complaints in our community. He updated the members on the following previous issues: Fire on Brayton Avenue – the fire department stated that their investigation concludes that this fire was not an arson, however, there is no update on the status of when the three houses will be torn down or renovated; Car-jacking on W 10th – this was classified as an aggravated robbery and the car has not been recovered to date; and the robbery near Fat Cats – this investigation is on-going. Sgt. Tim reiterated that crime is down statistically in Tremont. He reminded everyone that calling the non-emergency number or e-mailing the Commander can be effective methods to report suspicious activities. A question was raised regarding crime prevention. Sgt. Tim said that the Cleveland Police have many undercover cars in the area as well as marked cars patrolling until 2 am. He suggested that residents can help prevent crimes by keeping their front porch lights on and installing security cameras. Discussion focused on the issue of neighborhood lighting, especially the sidewalk lighting. It was pointed out that this issue about lighting has been brought up many, many times and seems to be stalled. Sgt. Tim said he could put through a request to trim trees that will help to improve the lighting in the area. Several other members stated that an effective way to highlight this issue would be at the Ward 3 Safety Meeting on Tuesday, May 15th – everyone was encouraged to attend this meeting as Councilman Kerry McCormack, Safety Coordinator Chad Biggers, police officers and others will be at this meeting, who can hear directly from the residents about this lighting issue and other safety concerns. Resident Mike Koski finished up the Safety Updates. The camera on W 7th and I490 has been funded and should be installed soon. He also reminded everyone that if you do have a security camera, it would be helpful if it was registered at the following website -- prosecuter.cuyahogacounty.us. This site only registers the address, phone number and e-mail address associated with the camera. Mike also reminded the members that if you see something suspicious to call rather than post on FaceBook as the information on the FB posts are limited and not as useful. Special guests at our meeting were a number of candidates for the TWDC Board. They were SOJ member Kate Carden, running for Board President as well as Ann Marie Riley and Seronica Powell who are both running for Board member positions. Members were reminded that if they cannot attend the annual Membership Dinner & Meeting on May 17th. Next, Brian McCreary and Paul Beegan presented a proposal for a 21 unit apartment building on the corner of W 7th and Jefferson. It was decided that the block club would vote on all five of the variances at once – not individually. The Bylaws for the SOJ Block Club specify that there must be a two-thirds majority for an issue to receive a Letter of Support. The vote was 15 in favor, 12 opposed – 3 votes short of the two-thirds majority in favor of all five variances. The block club will write a letter of explanation for the TWDC Economic Development committee regarding the outcome of the SOJ's vote. A quick wrap-up of other events in Tremont. Tremont Historic District Reaches 30 Year Mark

In May 1987, Tremont West Development Corporation approached the Cleveland Landmarks Commission to propose the creation of the Tremont Historic District. Creation of this district was proposed to recognize and maintain the architectural and cultural heritage of the neighborhood and to offer some protection against uncontrolled demolition of the aging building stock. The Tremont neighborhood had many of its structures remaining, in part, due to it being physically isolated by natural and manmade boundaries. After a year-long process, the Cleveland City Council passed Ordinance 821-88 establishing the Tremont Historic District on June 6, 1988.

Since then, the Local and National Register Historic Districts (listed 1994) have helped anchor development and revitalization in the neighborhood. Tremont has the feel of a small town with its public square, business district and its close-knit neighborhood. In addition to the current Historic District boundaries, there are a number of individual landmarked buildings helping support these developments. The numerous churches are important to the history of the development of the neighborhood and a reminder of its ethnic past. Using these structures as the backbone of the district allows for other restoration, adaptive reuse and new construction opportunities. The restoration of the Charles Olney Residence and Gallery was an important project as it is on a main entrance into the district. The Lincoln Park Baths Condominiums (1996) is an early example of a project which included both adaptive reuse and new construction in the city. More recently, the adaptive reuse of Our Lady of Mercy Church (2015) showed that sacred places can have additional uses beyond their original function. Currently, there is another major reuse project underway at the Zion Church and School which will help save and maintain these beautiful historic buildings while creating exciting living spaces. Projects like these help maintain the character of the district and can encourage others to do likewise by showing the possibilities of preservation and heritage conservation.

“The Landmarks Commission has enjoyed working with the Tremont-West Development Corporation and the residents of Tremont over the past 30 years,” said Donald Petit, Secretary of the Landmarks Commission, “We look forward to continuing that relationship and seeing the future development of the neighborhood.”


