Ronald McDonald Family Room to Expand Services at MetroHealth Medical Center

Critical Overnight Respite Offered to Families of Pediatric Patients

In many cases, families of pediatric patients are simply unable to leave the hospital, sometimes for many days at a time. The Ronald McDonald Family Room at MetroHealth Medical Center provides these families a place to rest and recharge just steps from their child's treatment room. Open from 9am – 9pm daily, the Family Room is equipped with a lounge area, full kitchenette stocked with snacks and beverages, children's play area, computer with internet access, and other things that bring comfort to families so they can remain strong for their children.

We are now thrilled to announce the upcoming opening of the Ronald McDonald Hospitality Suite at MetroHealth Medical Center, which will provide crucial overnight respite for families of Cleveland's most vulnerable patients. The Suite will feature four private rooms spacious enough to accommodate up to three guests. Each will be equipped with a mini-fridge and welcome basket with snacks, water, writing tablet, tissues and resource information. The rooms will share a quiet lounge area with a TV, comfortable La-Z-Boy furniture, vending machines, and a restroom with shower. Fresh linens, towels and toiletry items will be provided. Guests will continue to have access to the Ronald McDonald Family Room during the day.

The Ronald McDonald Hospitality Suite at MetroHealth is the first in Ohio, and is expected to serve hundreds of people per year, free of charge. Since our Family Room at Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital expanded in September to include two respite rooms, it has already hosted over 125 overnight guests. One of the first to benefit from this service was a new mother, who described her experience as "...a

blessing. It was so helpful and comforting to be able to be with [my son] during the day and overnight for his feedings and kangaroo care I can only imagine the added stress had I had to leave the hospital while he was still in the NICU." Another said "It was one of the hardest weeks of our lives, and using the room certainly meant the world to us. We can never begin to express how grateful we were..."

Since opening in 2010, the Ronald McDonald Family Room at MetroHealth has served over 96,000 visitors, a number that is growing as services expand and medical treatments advance. Helping these individuals is made possible by the kindness of dedicated volunteers, who have donated over 27,700 hours of their time. Are you interested in being a member of Tremont West?

Please note that according to the Code of Regulations, you must fill out a membership form to be a member of Tremont West Development Corporation. If you have not already done this since February of 2012, please do so as soon as possible. The deadline to be eligible to vote at the Tremont West Annual Membership meeting in May is **April 1, 2018**

You only need to fill a membership card out once, and then you are a member for life as long as you remain a resident or designated business representative of Tremont. Please take a few moments to fill out a membership card if you have not done so.

Eligibility for Membership

Membership is granted, upon completion of a membership card and verification that the applicant is:

- A.) A person eighteen (18) years of age or older, who owns real property or resides in the Membership Area; or,
- B.) A business that is located in the Membership Area.

A "business" includes but is not limited to the following legal entities: Nonprofit Corporation, Limited Liability Corporation, Corporation, Partnership, and Sole Proprietorship.

A business that is eligible for membership is required to designate one (1) representative to act as the voting member. An individual designated as a voting member by a business is not eligible to be a voting member as an individual who resides or owns real property in the Membership Area.

Affiliated Businesses are eligible for only one membership. "Affiliated Businesses" are businesses located in the Membership Area that are under the control of the same person or entity. Control is

ownership of more than 50% of the business. Paid employees of TWDC are not eligible to be voting members. Membership remains in effect until: 1) an individual member changes his or her residence address or dies; 2) a business member changes the location of its business or ceases operations.

Cleveland Public Library's Jefferson Branch in Tremont will be temporarily closed for repairs beginning mid-to-late March 2018

As Cleveland Public Library approaches its 150th anniversary, the Library is embarking on an ambitious, multi-year capital project to ensure its neighborhood branch libraries can continue to function as safe, inclusive, and sustainable environments.

The first phase of this two-pronged revitalization project will address critical repairs to ten branches located throughout the Library system. Branches impacted by this maintenance work include Lorain, Glenville, Jefferson, Harvard-Lee, Carnegie West, Addison, Fulton, Langston Hughes, Rockport, and Collinwood. As the first branches scheduled for construction, Lorain and Glenville temporarily closed on February 5, 2018. Additional branches will follow on a rolling basis throughout the spring and summer of 2018.

Most branch libraries are expected to close for approximately six to nine weeks. During this process, patrons in affected neighborhoods will be redirected to nearby branches to obtain library services. After the completion of repairs, the Library will seek feedback from within each branch's community to determine what additional improvements—such as configuring the interior space, making cosmetic improvements, incorporating new technologies, and more—might benefit the branch.

This branch revitalization plan marks the third system-wide capital project in Cleveland Public Library's nearly 150-year history. Changes for Jefferson Branch will focus on:

- ADA accessibility updates
- HVAC upgrades
- Electrical circuitry and control updates
- Fire alarms
- Roof replacement

While this branch is temporarily closed, the nearby Carnegie West Branch and South Branch (temporary location on Clark Avenue) will be open and ready to serve library patrons. To learn more about the branch revitalization project, visit CLEforgood.cpl.org.

A Gathering Place Community Art Project

All through the month of February, people who live, work, play and pray all throughout our Greater Tremont neighborhood have been translating their favorite seasonal neighborhood memories onto tile that will become part of our current community art project to be installed at the Gathering Place in front of Tremont General Store on Professor.

Even the most intrepid participants have been guided step-by-step through the image transfer, black and white inking and shading process by Tremont Community Artist in Residence, Angelica Pozo, and the results have been stunning. Many people have amazed themselves at their own results. It is a process that has required a bit more focus than the one of last project, but getting an opportunity to share a personal memory, from a photograph or drawing, and getting a personalized art lesson from Angelica to boot, has been well worth the extra patience.

There are still a few tiles available to be decorated, so some weekend open studios have been extended into March, while supplies last. Dates : Saturdays, March 3rd, and 10th, from 12:30 – 4:30pm, Sunday, March 4th, from 2:00 – 4:30pm. Sunday, March 10th, from 12:30 – 4:30pm. Additionally one could also join Art Crew core group and help with and learn about anything from mosaic work, glaze or decal application to installation.

Also available are Legacy Tiles, another way individuals, families, congregations and businesses can leave a lasting memory and create a legacy, while helping Central Tremont Block Club and Tremont Community Artist in Residence program raise funds to cover remaining costs of project. With a \$75 donation one can immortalize your family, a departed loved one, your church or business on a tile permanently installed in a prominent place on the bench and with a decal printed photo screened into background of desired inscription as you see in pictured samples. Homemade Thai Food Finds New Home in Tremont

One of the most beautiful and historic corners in Tremont now has even more to offer. Nestled on the edge of Kenilworth and West 11th and across from Lincoln Park, Merchant Street now has a new next-door neighbor in Corner 11 Bowl and Wrap. The corner was already home to gorgeous 19th century buildings like Lemko Hall and the restored Flandermyer Drug Building where Civilization calls home. Since March 1st, 2391 West 11th is also home to the first poke restaurant in Tremont.

Sitthichok Sitthimontol and his wife Thiwaporn Sirisuwan did not originally set out to be restaurant owners. Sitthimontol is currently working towards his law degree to go with several master's degrees he's already earned. Sirisuwan, who also has several degrees, had a passion for cooking, but did not consider opening a Thai restaurant until urged to do so by friends and family.

Although the restaurant is a new venture for the family, they have been honing their craft for years. "We travel and we eat," said Sitthimontol in regard to their research. The couple has visited over 25 states as well as continual trips to Thailand to study Thai dishes and incorporate tastes and flavors from all over the world. Their passion for poke became evident on a trip to Hawaii where they sampled over 50 different recipes. This Hawaiian dish consists of raw, marinated fish tossed over rice and accompanied by vegetables and unique sauces.

At Corner 11, poke comes in three sizes: small, medium, and large. Small comes with one protein option, medium comes with two, and large three. Each bowl also comes with three toppings. Guests can choose from options like chicken, beef, tofu and mango, onion, pineapple, jalapeno, and carrot.

Soups are also a large part of the menu, and special, seasonal soups will be showcased as well. Options include curry soup, a traditional North Thailand dish, as well as miso soup, ramen, and a traditional seafood soup called yen-ta-fo. "You will not find this soup anywhere else in Cleveland," said Sitthimontol.

Special appetizers include thai stix, a combo of crab and cream cheese, as well as two handmade Northeastern Thailand style sausages. The drink menu is also exceptional. Choices range from Thai coffee, Thai ice tea, green tea, jasmine tea, passionfruit tea, and even bubble tea. "Our menu is completely original, local, and made fresh every morning," said Sitthimontol.

The restaurant's physical amenities include a patio that faces Lincoln Park, a casual dining place, pick-up-and-go

options, as well as a naturally-lit living room space for guests that want to relax, get comfy, and stay awhile. The counter and bussing stations were built by hand and go well with the wood finishes of the floor and tables.

Corner 11 Bowl and Wrap is open Monday through Sunday from 11:30 AM through 9:00 PM. Though new to Tremont and the restaurant business, the recipes and passion for Thai food at this quaint eatery have spent years in the making.

Nominations for Block Club officers took place. Chris McGonnell agreed to be nominated as Block Club Secretary. No other nominations for that office were placed. Chris was nominated, and elected for the next 12 month period. No-one agreed to become the Chairperson of the Block Club. A motion was made and seconded to table this vote to the month of April. 
South of Jefferson

Michael reminded everyone that this was a presentation of zoning issues only and not of the design plan. Briefly, the Catania Court Townhomes Phase 3 incorporates four townhomes that face Marquardt Avenue and one single family home that is located behind the townhomes. One parcel of this plan includes a Land Bank parcel owned by the City of Cleveland which encompasses Unit 4 of the townhomes and the single family rear home. The City of Cleveland is requiring this development to maximize density and situate the living spaces, e.g. the living room, kitchen, etc., along the sidewalk – the level that will face Marquardt Avenue. Thus, the garages will be located behind the townhomes in a basement level. Michael stated that there will be substantial excavation to meet these requirements. It was noted that the firm accounted for SOJ members' concerns and suggestions that were received at both the November 2017 block club meeting and at separate meetings with neighbors. The main issue centers on the size and placement of the single family rear structure. Michael stated that the rear structure was revised to reduce its size – both five feet of the back and 800 square feet of living space from the third floor were eliminated. The third floor now features a “doghouse” to allow access to a deck area. When questioned further on specifically how tall this structure will be, Michael stated that it was now 21-22 feet above grade and 30 feet at its tallest point when the three foot “doghouse” was included. Several SOJ members voiced concerns regarding the single family rear structure which included: the elimination of the area green space, the placement of this home does not reflect the style and neighborhood of this block in Tremont, the size of this structure is too tall and the elimination of approximately 33 trees and most likely other trees of the adjacent neighbors. Several neighbors surrounding the proposed development stated that they were also trying to secure the Land Bank parcel to preserve a green space. After further discussion, a motion was put forward for the SOJ block club to vote on supporting the four townhome units as presented without the single family rear unit. This motion was passed, 17-1. Another motion was put forward for the SOJ block club to vote for the entire unit as presented – this includes the four townhomes and the single family rear unit. This motion was defeated, 15-3. The SOJ Block Club will write a letter outlining the motion that was passed. Resident, Madison Trainer, volunteered to be the SOJ Social Chair/Coordinator. She will be in charge of the 50/50 monthly raffles at the block club meetings as well as organizing the summer and winter holiday parties. Scott Rosenstein announced several upcoming events: The Cleveland Marathon will be running through Tremont on May 20th; Metro Health Hospital is seeking volunteers for their Ronald McDonald Suite; Membership in Tremont West requires that a brief membership form be completed. If you have completed a form in the past 6 years, please fill out a form by April 1st in order to vote at the Tremont West Annual Meeting on May 17th; SOJ Block Club had a very successful Holiday Food Drive achieving second place with special thanks to this year's coordinators Rachel Slosberg Coolidge, Tom Tosuksri and Kate Carden. Many thanks to SOJ members who brought in paper supplies for Post 58. Child Care – Mary W. Butler Education Center Program is provided to children ages 6 weeks to 5 years old. Early Childhood Education Program is a provider of Universal Pre-Kindergarten. This program assures that 3-5 year olds receive high quality care that promotes development and readiness.

MomsFirst – MomsFirst is an outreach program, free to everyone, for pregnant women, sponsored by the City of Cleveland. Community Health Workers: help to find

doctors for mothers and their babies, help mothers get to the doctor for checkups, connect mothers to medical and/or social services, provide answers to questions about prenatal care, birth control and family planning, and help deliver a healthy baby.

Youth Services – Due to the Temporary closing of the Jefferson Library, youth programs will transition to Merrick House at the end of March. Merrick House provides youth programming Monday through Friday from 2:30 to 5:30. Merrick House is a MyCom site, which is a network that connects Greater Cleveland youth to their neighborhoods and futures. Merrick House provides opportunities to learn about entrepreneurship as well as opportunities for youth to learn about healthy eating in a community garden and greenhouse. A Mentor Me series will start in April. The program welcomes any volunteers who would like to be involved in the Community Garden and any restaurants willing to aide in healthy cooking demonstrations.


