

The May 8th **Primary Election**

There are many important decisions for voters on the May 8th Primary Election Ballot. These include candidates for Governor, statewide offices, US Senate, US Congress, State House and Senate. The County Executive and some members of County Council as well as judicial candidates will also be on the ballot.

This Partisan Primary Election is an opportunity for Democratic, Republican and Green party voters to select the candidates who will advance to the November General Election. However all voters including nonpartisans will have an opportunity to decide State, County, school and municipal

The May 8th Primary also offers people the opportunity to establish their party affiliation, change their party, or become nonpartisan voters. In Ohio the type of ballot voters choose determines their party affiliation.

People who wish to cast ballots by mail need to obtain, complete, and return their Vote by Mail applications as soon as possible. To request an application visit: www.443vote. com, or call 216-443-VOTE (8683). Vote by Mail ballot applications are also available at all public libraries.

Early voting is available from April 10th through May 7th at the Board of Elections located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland.

Laurie Myers Yoga Invites Tremont to Reconnect

The growing business community on Tremont's West 14th Street will soon be adding a Flow Yoga studio to its list of restaurants and services. Starting May 2018, Laurie Myers Yoga will open their doors at 2673 W. 14th Street. Most recently, Myers offered classes at The Cultural Center on Professor Avenue. The new location, which was previously an office and before that a hair salon, is approximately 500 square feet and takes full advantage of all available space. With the new location also comes the opportunity for Myers to take full ownership of the studio and classes.

Studio services will include both group and private yoga classes and Thai yoga "We welcome massage sessions. apprehensive beginners and unsatisfied yoga veterans to reconnect themselves to their bodies, selves, and others through their practice of yoga," said Myers. "All classes include a reflective theme as well as instructional hands-on-assists," she continued.

Classes are offered Monday through Thursday at 6 PM and Saturday and Sunday at 9 AM. All classes are seventyfive minutes. Thai messages are offered in 60, 75, or 90-minute options. There is also a "Quick Fix" option which included a head, neck, and shoulder massage. Massages and private classes can be scheduled online at lauriemyersyoga.com. Though not currently available, the studio may one day offer yoga teacher training as well. Myers is also joined by instructor Lynn Rodemann. Rodemann teaches All Level Flow at 6 PM on Wednesdays and Slow Flow at 9 AM on Saturdays. The studio will also offer donation classes once a month. All proceeds from this class go to charitable organizations in the community.

Myers has over four years' experience as an instructor and has earned three Yoga Alliance Credentials including E-RYT 200 (Experienced Registered Yoga Teacher), RYS (Registered Yoga School), and YACEP (Yoga Alliance Continuing Education Provider).

Though she is now a veteran, Myers had a surprising start to her yoga career. The first class she attended was based solely on a friend's recommendation. "After one

session, I was hooked and my entire perception changed," said Myers. Within one week, I knew I wanted to teach,' she continued. Myers hopes her services can do the same to change the perception of yoga for others who are unsure about the benefits.

As for the benefits of the new studio space, Myers enlisted local businesses to help achieve her vision. With the help of William Sabetta Design, the studio features a beautiful wooden pivoting door with built in planter boxes. The wall provides a boundary or blockade when needed and can also swing flat against the wall to allow for more class space. Sabetta Design, with the goal of functionality, also retrofitted the storefront to create personal shelving and cubbyholes for guests to place belongings. The walls, floors, and lighting have also been redone with the help of local businesses like Heavenly Hardwood.

"The design of the studio and classes is my vision of boutique yoga, "said Myers. "Boutiques are inviting and welcoming- so are we."

Central Tremont

Julie Goulis and Lynne Nowell, Block Club Co-Chairs, called the meeting to order. Everyone in attendance (30 individuals) introduced themselves and shared where they lived in the neighborhood. Hailey, from Horton Harper Architects, passed out the revised site plans for the partial demolition and rehabilitation of the commercial structure at the NE corner of West 5th and Jefferson. A plan had previously been presented to the block club whereby the building would be demolished except for the foundation. Due to the land bank's response to that proposal and its request that the developer preserve more of the existing building, the plan has now shifted. When all is said and done, the building will have six condos, 4 one-bedroom units and 2 two-bedroom units. Two of the one-bedroom units will be held for lower income buyers at a price of \$180k. The other four units will be market rate but an amount was not given. The bike shop will still remain but move to the basement of the building with an entrance on Jefferson. The height of the building will remain the same as it is now at 33 feet. There were three notices of non-conformance that the City of Cleveland zoning department issued that Horton Harper is asking for support on a variance for from the block club. A vote of support was taken on each variance. One member opposed the parking variance. The other variances were supported unanimously. Dan Cotter, resident and Board Member of Tremont West since 2016, is also a member of the board nominating sub-committee and is speaking at each block club meeting to give an overview of the process. In order to vote for a board candidate, you would have had to register as a Tremont West member by April 1st. The annual Tremont West Membership meeting where the Board will be voted on is May 17th. Matt Moss, Housing and Economic Development Director from Tremont West, was introduced and distributed a map that outlined the areas where the City of Cleveland is proposing rezoning along West 5th and the Towpath Trail. The green section on the map is to be converted from general-industrial to open space recreational. The red section of the map is to be converted from semi-industrial to residential multi-family. The original height for this type of residential multi-family zone would have allowed a maximum height of 115 feet. However, after feedback was received at the initial public meetings related to this proposal, the height for the new zoning has been reduced to 60 feet. A great deal of residents who currently live in Bergen Village were in attendance at the meeting and had several questions, namely why the height would be 60 feet in relation to existing residential buildings that are only 30 feet. The zoning code in Cleveland has three aspects: height, area, and use. The city is aiming for more multi-family zoning in the Tremont area since the majority of the developments that have been built recently are single family townhomes. They believe that the completion of the towpath will have a large, positive economic impact and they are hoping to use that as a catalyst for further growth. Jeff from the Bergen Village home owners association mentioned that a vote was taken with their group and they would like to see a single family, residential district with a max height of 30 feet. There was a motion to support the use variance from general industrial to open space rec in the red section; this was approved unanimously. Another motion was raised to propose a multi-family use, a maximum of 35 feet in height, and area district of H. A vote was taken and the motion was approved by those who had voting rights at the meeting. A representative from the Rite Aid Marathon was slated to attend the meeting but cancelled at short notice. A map that the individual had forwarded on was distributed to the group. Dharma Valentin was introduced and detailed events to take place in April. She advised those in attendance to check *Inside Tremont* as well as well as subscribe to Tremont West's weekly e-news. The April meeting of the South of Jefferson Block Club was held at Roosevelt Post 58 on Tuesday, April 10th. Cleveland Police Sgt. Tim Maffo-Judd led off the meeting by addressing relevant safety issues. He encouraged the members to be on the lookout for vehicle break-ins between 11pm and 4am. He assured the members that his department has the incidents mapped out and are noticing patterns with his units and undercover units aggressively looking for the criminals. A vote was held and the block club agreed to support the variances with a 13 yes votes and 3 no. Matt Moss from Tremont West then presented the City of Cleveland's proposed rezoning of the parcels between West 5th Street and the new towpath. Moss outlined the parcels that are currently zoned for industrial use. According to Moss, the City would prefer housing and small businesses along the towpath through Tremont and that Tremont is the first real neighborhood that the towpath thought remont and that Tremont is the first real neighborhood that the towpath touches headed south. Moss then gave a breakdown of city zoning code descriptions reaching all the way back to 1929 followed by opening up discussion. Of much discussion was the City's desire for a height restriction of 60 feet versus many members' desire for a 35 foot restriction, which is the most common in the block club footprint. A guest from Central Tremont Block Cclub pointed out that his block club voted for a 35' restriction citing that it was more in line with the City's own 2025 Plan. All agreed multifamily would be fine, but area usage came under some debate. The club voted unanimously 16-0 to support the city's plan to designate a green zone along the new towpath. The club then voted unanimously 16-0 to approve the city's plan to rezone land usage from industrial to multifamily. The club moved to vote on a height restriction of 35' and unanimously voted 16-0 to approve that distinction from the city. A move to vote on a different area usage was then made and the members voted 14 yes and 2 no to support a "G" designation requiring developers to seek variances for projects that would want more square footage. 
