Café Social to open its doors in Tremont on Professor Avenue

Two years after its creation, Café Social is jump-starting its next phase with a move to Tremont, a shift that will allow it to deepen and expand its community roots. This unique café offers coffee sourced exclusively from Latin America (in partnership with several Cleveland-based suppliers), along with family desserts and snacks that come from the owner's own Latin American background. You will find strong café negro and espresso, along with lattes and cappuccinos, as well as an ongoing variety of prepared coffee drinks that run from traditional to decadent and inventive. Desserts include family recipes from Mexico, as well as treats from many other Latin American countries—everything from a mini Mexican cheesecake to a Caribbean panna cotta, cuernito cookies, and Venezuelan pastel de parchita... along with new more savory offerings.

Owner Lalo Rodriguez describes himself as CEO, co-founder, barista, janitor and baker, among many other things. The café's story comes from his parents' tradition in Mexico where they used to gather with friends on Thursday afternoons for a "jueves social" – a late afternoon coffee and sweets break before the later club nightlife began. It was a place to meet new people and to share ideas on poetry, movies, and life; and it was the event that officially opened the weekend. Fast forward to Cleveland decades later, and Café Social wins a small incubator grant to get started as a family project, thanks to his father, Eduardo Rodriguez, and the tradition is reborn.

Café Social continues with a commitment to both social life and social justice, with its work to partner with fair sourcing groups and its desire to create a place where people from Latin America or people interested in Latin America can all feel welcome. Speakers of English, Spanish and every other language, and people from all walks of life are all invited to come enjoy some Latin American coffee. The Café is excited to embrace Tremont's own commitment to diversity and creative exchange and is looking forward to joining the neighborhood.

For his part, Lalo is thrilled to take on this new entrepreneurial opportunity. When he's not at the café, you can find him working as an actor and making art.

Tremont West's Board of Directors is comprised of 15 community members. These members are democratically elected by the membership on a rotating basis; each year the membership elects a Board President (one year term) and 4 or 5 Directors who will serve a three year term.

Whether you have plans to sell your house or live in it for the rest of your life, it is essential for all homeowners to carry out repairs and regular maintenance. Minor fixes can help you prevent serious problems in the future. Here are some of the public and private loans, grants, and agencies providing home repair resources to help.

Must be a low or moderate-income family, live in the property, and attend Lead Safe Work Practice Class.

HFLA lends money interest-free to responsible individuals in need who have been denied by a conventional lender. Maximum loan amount is \$10,000.

Heritage Home Program

The Heritage Home Program offers a low-interest, fixed-rate, equity-based loan for maintaining and improving their older homes. Interest rates can go up to 2% in Cleveland. Homes must be 50 years old or older.

Community Housing Solutions

CHS offers a tool loan program, housing counseling, and home repair assistance.

Home Weatherization and Housewarming Assistance

Services may include furnace repair/replacement, hot water tank repair/replacement, insulation, refrigerator and/or freezer replacement, light bulbs and electrical repairs/updates, minor plumbing repairs, water leaks, main water line repair, and clearing of blockage or replacement of main sewer line.

Cuyahoga County Veterans Services Commission

Provides temporary and emergency financial assistance to eligible veterans, their dependents, and surviving spouses for rent, mortgages, security deposits, etc.

Senior Homeowner Assistance Program

SHAP provides a grant to income qualified Cleveland homeowners 60 years old or older, and disabled adults who reside in and own single or two family homes in need of critical health, safety, and maintenance repairs.

Repair-A-Home

Low interest loans for code related repairs, mechanical repairs, or health and safety repairs.

Sunny Ting has been sharing his award winning Thai recipes with Tremont since 2006 when he opened Ty Fun Thai Bistro as owner and chef. After almost 14 years, Sunny and his family still have more to share with the community. Available for immediate enjoyment at 815 Jefferson Avenue, Ty Fun's second floor is now "Buddha Blue" – Tremont's newest private party room.

Sunny purchased the property in 2018 with plans to do more with the building's potential. After a year of renovations, a bedroom and storage room were transformed into a calming open space with bar service and seating to host parties of 20 or less. Sunny credits his sister, Jessy Cika, with designing and providing the direction that lead to the room's beautiful finish. "She picked the lights, fixtures, furniture, paintings – everything," said Sunny. Jessy has worked at Ty Fun for 12 years and also manages the restaurant with Sunny.

The party room, which will offer Ty Fun's menu to guests starting this Spring, has a long marble bar, a large dining area, a great view, a private bathroom, and blue accents that make the space feel cool and inviting. Sunny describes the theme as "soothing and relaxing".

"Buddha Blue is perfect for birthdays, rehearsal dinners, or any community function," said Sunny.

Fact: The Mediterranean diet, which includes healthy fats, is by far the healthiest for one's heart. It is rich in fruits, vegetables, legumes, fish, nuts and olive oil. Dr. Shah says this diet is proven to help reduce bad cholesterol levels and reduce the risk of cardiovascular events like stroke and heart attack.

"It's important to know the facts to take the proper steps to decrease heart disease risk," advises Dr. Shah.


