


## Tremont Sculptor, Giancarlo Calicchia, Creates a Garden

Giancarlo is proud to call Tremont home. Many neighbors know him and some might just recognize his name and artwork in the storefront and studio located at 722 Literary Road. Alongside his building in the past year, we've all watched as a beautiful garden has been sprouting up. We first noticed some trees and flowers and today, although not yet complete, the garden is home to three of Giancarlo's sculptures, buckwheat from Ukraine, nut and fruit trees, hops that will grow up the side of his building, a waterfall flowing into a soon to be koi pond, the sweetest vegetable garden and many, many flowers.

Giancarlo is a master stone worker and has built many



fountains in the city and around the world. We are very lucky to now have one here in Tremont (photo below). The garden has yet to be named, but he did say that he is working with his friend and Tremont neighbor, Jack Ricchiuto, on developing a conversation series, where he will welcome neighbors into the space to converse with each other on many different topics.

Giancarlo is photographed above with his sculpture named "Forever". He sculpted this piece out of marble from North Carolina. He had this stone for many years and one day, while visiting a hospital, he became inspired by a couple that appeared to be in their eighties, all intertwined in a loving embrace. The other two sculptures you can see from the side walk are "Family" above, and "Looking Forward", photographed on the left. Both are sculpted out of Ohio sandstone.

On May 19th 2022 Tremont West Development Corporation hosted its Annual Membership Meeting at Scranton Road Bible Church. The Board of Directors opted for an in-person meeting (with early voting available). The Board wanted people to have the ability to be in person and share a meal together. Many of you came out to support the organization. Thank you! Unfortunately, we were unable to meet quorum due to lingering concerns over COVID and other factors. We weren't sure exactly how it would turn out so we will learn from the experience moving forward. In the meantime, the Board of Directors will meet in June. During the June meeting, the Board members with expiring terms will resign their seats and appointments to the new terms will be made. The votes cast during early voting and in-person at the Annual Meeting will be taken into account as the appointments to the Board are made.

### 2022 PAINT PROGRAM

The City of Cleveland has opened its 2022 Paint Program, which provides free vouchers for exterior paint and supplies for owner-occupants and tenants. You may qualify for up to \$600.00 in free paint and supplies. *Labor is not included.* If accepted into the program, the applicant must attend Lead Safe Practice Class.

This program is for low- to moderate- income families based on total household income. Reference the table below to see if your household qualifies.

Household Size*	1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8
Moderate Income**	\$51,600	\$59,000	\$66,350	\$73,700	\$79,600	\$85,500	\$91,400	\$97,300

Applicants will need to provide proof of residency (utility bill, W-2) and proof of income (two weeks consecutive pay stubs, Social Security Benefit letter, copy of Pension statement).





# Block Club Happenings

## Auburn-Lincoln Park

The block club met on Monday, May 16th via the Zoom platform - online and by phone with 11 residents and 6 guests participating. There was a safety update with Lt. Stephen Beckner of the 2nd District Police Community Services Unit, who addressed safety concerns, such as the recent carjacking in Duck Island and the late-night loud music at Clark Field parking lot. Lt. Beckner encourages us to keep calling, to establish a pattern of complaints about a particular situation. Also, please refer anyone interested in policing careers to him, as they are currently 90+ short-staffed. Please be aware of your surroundings, skip the earbuds, turn on your outside lights, leave your junk in your trunk, etc. Also, we now know that calling 216-621-1234 is the same as calling 911, in Cleveland. Three of the 9 candidates seeking election/re-election to the Tremont West Board of Directors at the May 19th Tremont West Annual Membership meeting - Dan Cotter, Deb Smith, and Jaime Delet - gave brief introductions and asked for our support. Guest, Jacob Toole, explained the Cleveland Marathon & Half Marathon route through Tremont & Duck Island on Sun. May 22nd (miles 5.8 - 9.0) of the course. Runners will pass down Starkweather between 7:33AM thru 8:39AM on Sun. May 22nd; streets should be open to traffic by 9am. Runners often say how FUN it is to run through Tremont, so let's try to make it FUN!!! Resident Yvonne Bruce discussed the city's slow response to her request for trash bins & lids in Lincoln Park, and will send a follow-up letter Ccing folks who might have influence; also, Yvonne and Denise Kadilak are coordinating monthly clean-and-weed dates in Lincoln Park on the 2nd Monday of June/ July/Aug/Sep (mark your calendars and please help). Also discussed the many broken tiles on Angelica Pozo's community engagement tile wall by the south side of the gazebo, caused by improperly poured concrete footers and perhaps lawnmowers; resolution to be determined. Denise notes that very few have stepped up this year to be Tremont Gardeners, and all are welcome! The Tremont Farmers Market returns to Lincoln Park on Tuesdays, 4-7pm. The Tremont Greek Fest returns after a 2 year pandemic hiatus, Friday, May 27th through Monday, May 30th at Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church (2187 W. 14th Street & Fairfield). On Tuesday, May 17th, NOL held a meeting at Polish Veterans Post 1 attended by 20 voting members, 11 new members and/or residents and 7 guests. Sgt. Frank Woyma and NOL members discussed the carjacking that occurred on the evening of May 16th in Tremont. A resident was returning home and as she pulled her car into her garage in the alley between 7th Street and 6th Street, a car with 3 juveniles sped through the alley and one of them ran into her garage, pointed a gun at her, and took her car and purse. There was clear video of the perpetrators; they have been identified as being involved in a number of crimes in the area...all are juveniles. Warrants are being issued for them and the police hope to have them in custody as soon as they can be located. Sgt. Woyma suggested that the Block Club invite prosecutors and judges to speak about cases at block club meetings so that community concerns and accountability can be discussed. Sgt. Woyma brought up the "dirt bike" issue, suggesting that a "dirt bike sting" is scheduled and it is hoped that many of the offending bikes will be off the street after that. Guest, Jay Toole, discussed the specifics...times and routes...of the Cleveland Marathon to be held Sunday, May 22nd. The course route comes down W. 11th Street from Abbey to Starkweather - then west to Scranton Road - and then north to Ohio City. Toole encouraged us to come out and cheer on the runners. Giancarlo Calicchia and Geiss architect, Brandon Klein, presented conceptual plans for the former Sokolowski site. The property is small...only .4 acre. They are proposing interaction with public walkways, a public terrace with sculptural /artistic elements and small "pods" or eateries. Projected timing includes schematic design review in 2 to 3 weeks, BZA submission in 3 months, ground breaking in early fall, with a 14-to-16-month construction period. The group was not against some level of appropriate development. There is concern that City Planning may have already provided some degree of initial approval for the concept. The property owners present said they appreciated the groups input. # Bladder cancer: Know the warning signs.

If a simple visit to the bathroom has you seeing red, don't ignore it. Blood in your urine can be a sign of a serious problem, so you should see your doctor right away.

"Blood in the urine could be a sign of bladder cancer or a less serious condition. It's important to undergo testing to determine the cause to allow early detection and treatment," says Nima Almassi, MD, a urologist at the Moll Cancer

Center at Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital and the Richard E. Jacobs Health Center at Richard E. Jacobs Campus in Avon.

Blood in the urine, the most important warning sign of bladder cancer, may show up over a long time, come and go or happen just once. Regardless of the frequency, it's still important to get evaluated.

Dr. Almassi shares these warning signs of bladder cancer:


- **Blood in the urine:** You may see a range of colors – pink, slightly dark, bright red or cola-colored urine.
- **Pain during urination:** A painful or a burning sensation when you urinate.

"Frequent urination or difficulty urinating are symptoms that bladder cancer patients may have, although there are also benign, noncancerous, conditions that can cause these symptoms," says Dr. Almassi.

Patients with these symptoms may require testing to determine the cause of the bleeding. For patients diagnosed with bladder cancer, surgery, chemotherapy,

immunotherapy and radiation therapy are common treatment options. And, sometimes, combinations of these treatments will be used.

It's important to seek medical treatment quickly. A delay can compromise the bladder cancer cure rate. Dr. Almassi says, "Instead of wondering if something is wrong, make an appointment and have it checked out. It's better to err on the side of caution."

## Stroke: BE FAST

In a stroke, every minute counts. Use the BE FAST method to evaluate if someone may be having a stroke:

- B** **BALANCE:** Watch for a sudden loss of balance.
- E** **EYES:** Watch for sudden loss of vision or double vision.
- F** **FACE:** Watch for face droop on one side.
- A** **ARMS:** Watch for one arm to drift downward.
- S** **SPEECH:** Listen for slurred or strange speech.
- T** **TIME:** If you observe any of these signs, call 911!

CGR has made the decision to remove its aluminum and steel collection bins, in order to support the City's recycling initiative. If it appears that a need still exists for this service, we will revisit this decision in the future.
